HARRY GRIMSEY Citizen of the Year Award

Citizen of the Year Harry Grimsey is well-known in the Huon Valley community. Throughout his life he has been very commununity-minded and involved in many activities in public life, church, the sports arena and local theatre.

Some of Harry's achievements in public life linclude serving six years as a Huon Minicipal Councillor from 1985 to 1992; Kingborough Health Forum Past Chairman and Convenor; Polling Officer and Assistant Returning Officer for all Commonwealth and State elections in the Huon municipality for 34 years; Collector and Controller of six Commonwealth Censuses in the Huon Municipality over a 29 year period.

Harry has been just as active on the sporting field with stints in local cricket teams, football teams, rifle shooting, tennis, golf, and lately, lawn bowls.

Harry has been a member and supporter of many organisations, including Huon Eldercare; Hobart Royal Agricultural Society; Huon Show Society and the RACT. He is a life member of the Huonville High School Parents and Friends Association and served many years as president.

Harry is a man of many talents. He has been involved in the Cygnet Singers since 1985 and was a founding member of the Huon Valley Theatre when it was established in 1988. He still organises and coordinates the annual Schools Plays Festival to encourage and support drama and arts in schools. A highlight of Harry's stage career came in 2001 when he sang in a professional production of Gilbert and Sullivan at the new Federation Concert Hall.

Harry has been involved in the Huonville Community Church, now called the Community Church, since 1945. He has sung in the choir, conducted a youth group along with his wife Faye, taught Sunday School for many years and was a Sunday School superintendent for 14 years. He was a church deacon and served on various committees, was a delegate to the congregational union and has been a lay preacher and performed baptisms when requested. Harry currently attends St James Anglican Church at Ranelagh.

Considering the length and breadth of Harry's contributions to the many organisations he has served, it is fitting that he is proclaimed the Huon Valley Council's Citizen of the Year.

Collecting discarded cans is part of Jack's daily routine. Just after lunch each day, Jack gets into his green Zephyr and drives up the highway to the spot where he finished the previous day's rubbish collection and starts his roadside can removal - just the way he has done every summer's day for the past 25 years.
