## 2017-18 Community Grants

These are just some of the successful projects to receive funding from the Huon Valley Council through its 2017-18 Community Grants program.

Huon Valley Council Commissioner Adriana Taylor said she was pleased to announce this year's recipients.

"The Community Grants have been awarded for the last 22 years. Many community activities, projects and events have been initiated and supported.

"These initiatives add vibrancy to our community and have given organisations opportunities to take part in community events, access to sporting equipment and opportunities to improve events and facilities throughout the Huon Valley.

"This year, we again had a difficult task in choosing which projects to support." Council received 33 applications. Of those, 12 were successful and more than \$18,000 has been awarded," Commissioner Taylor said.
